The Small Business Capital and Infrastructure Grants Program will support small businesses with capital resources that can be used for infrastructure improvements, acquisition of essential equipment, or purchase of new property.

Award Range: \$10,000 - \$245,000

Eligible Applicants: Businesses owned by Socially Economically Disadvantaged Individuals (SEDI) with a maximum of 25 full-time permanent employees

OR Very Small Businesses (VSBs), businesses with less than 10 employees

Steps to get pre-qualified for State of Illinois programs

STEP 1 Obtain a Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN) – FREE

STEP 2 Register with the Illinois Secretary of State and obtain a Certificate of Good Standing – COST

STEP 3 Register at System Award Management (SAM.gov) – FREE

STEP 4 Register with the Grant Accountability & Transparency Act (GATA)
Grantee Portal – FREE

STEP 5 Check your entity's Prequalification status in the GATA Grantee Portal to ensure your entity is in good standing.
